11.1. Contractors' Licences and Insurance

Cr Michael Vaughan has requested that local suppliers provide licences and insurance for all contracted works for Council.

11.2 Access for Sail Boats

President Neil White noted there have been several enquiries to Council regarding beach access at the old Erickson boat ramp for local sailing enthusiasts. Large rocks were placed as a community safety measure to prevent access after the big storms eroded the dune in February 2021. There are also concerns that Emergency Services cannot currently access the beach should there be an emergency.

Councillors agreed that restricted beach access should be allowed, however management of this was critical. A suggestion was made that a new boom gate be installed at the carpark entrance to the track and a key be made available for parties that want to use the access on the basis they pay a deposit to ensure the return of the key.

It was also noted that the Erickson beach access road to carpark has some major potholes which need urgent repairs. CEO advised that this has been added to the contractor's job list.

Actions for CEO to follow up:

• Consultation with appropriate Departments and Crown Land for permission and support to install a permanent structure.

11.3 Ziplocked Gates

It was noted that recently many properties have had the gates ziplocked with cable ties. CEO advised that several reports had come from residents to Council office as noted in her report. There are concerns from the community that properties appearing to be vacant are being targeted. Humpty Doo Police have been informed and will investigate.
